## Project Updates

- **GP Connect – HTML** – Dual running ended 20 November 24
- **BadgerNet** –ST&S and NuTH live 12th November 24.
- **North Tees FT** – planning to go live to share clinic letters April 2025.
- **County Durham & Darlington FT** – Testing phase extended to work through a number of test issues within EPR.
- **Northumbria FT** - preparing to go live to share clinic letters 4th December 24
- **South Tees FT** – developed enhancements to their encounter/visit messaging to provide more data. Go live is planned 6th December 24.
- **Cumberland Council** – Adult social care data went technically live 12 November 24. An operational go live is planned 4th December 24.
- **Westmorland & Furness Council** – Adult social care data went technically live 12 November 24. An operational go live is planned 4th December 24.

- **Usage** - 950,000 views in November.
- **HIE Major Upgrade** from 2023.1.32 to 2024.1.8 planned to start January 2025.
- **EMIS** moving to new API – go live 5 December 24.
